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Auture Tasks of the Alliance - Sub-Group 3

The Sub-Group on general defensive policy of the Alliance chaired by Mr. F.D. Kohler met on 18th May. The next meeting will be held in Washington during the first week of October.

An examination was made of the outline of a report prepared by the Resporteur in the form of a series of questions relating to :

- the current politico-military situation, and - the relationship of NATO defense policies and programmes to the broader political objectives of the Alliance.

It was agreed that this outline would serve as a basis to the Reprorteur for preparing before 31st May the interia report to be outsitted in June to the Ministers.

Members of the Sub-Group will then submit their written comments on the "Questionnaire" to the Ropportour who will accue by mid-Ceptember a first draft of the report.

A few soliant points in the discussion

The report on defendive policy should be cituated within the tremework of the general purpose of MATO as described in the Morth Atlantic Treaty.

Attention should be focused on the necessity and/or advantages of a multilateral alliance as against the recent tendency in the Eastern Dioc for a network of bi-lateral treaties which might lead for propaganta purposes to the discolution of the Corsaw Pact.

The Sub-Group should not exemine what changes in the level and form of the military posture of the Allience would be necessary in the future to react to the expected evolution outside MARO but rather define if and how the defence posture chould be medified in order that the cituation outside MARO may evolve in a way most feverable to the Alliance.

The Sub-Group should consider what disarmoment and/or erms control moneures might be envisaged which would not endanger the present cocurity of NATO countries while lowering the East-West military belonce and what might be the reculting defence policy of MATO.

The study should be placed against the background of the nlenned trends in the edvence of technology.

Attention should be given to docision making procedures.

Impact of the IMEO defence posture on the Emird Torld should be envisaged within the fremework of the position of IMEO as on organization covered by Article 51 of the U.N. Charter.

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
